DRYING THE EASY WAY

We asked stylist Michael Douglas for his top tips for achieving a brilliant blow-dry at home – easier said than done, you say? Well, Michael reckons it's easy when you know how.

✦ 'Start by sectioning off the hair with clips,' he says. 'You can't tackle the hair all at once, so it will make your job so much easier to section off different areas and dry them in stages.'

✦ 'Everyone's hair has different life cycles. There are long strands, medium strands and shorter strands. But to stop shorter hairs looking frizzy and flyaway when you blow-dry, use a brush with lots of bristles to catch every hair and leave the finished result really smooth.'

✦ 'Attach the nozzle to your hairdryer. It's vital for achieving a smooth result. And make sure you direct the airflow from your dryer down the hair shaft to keep any flyaways smooth.' >>

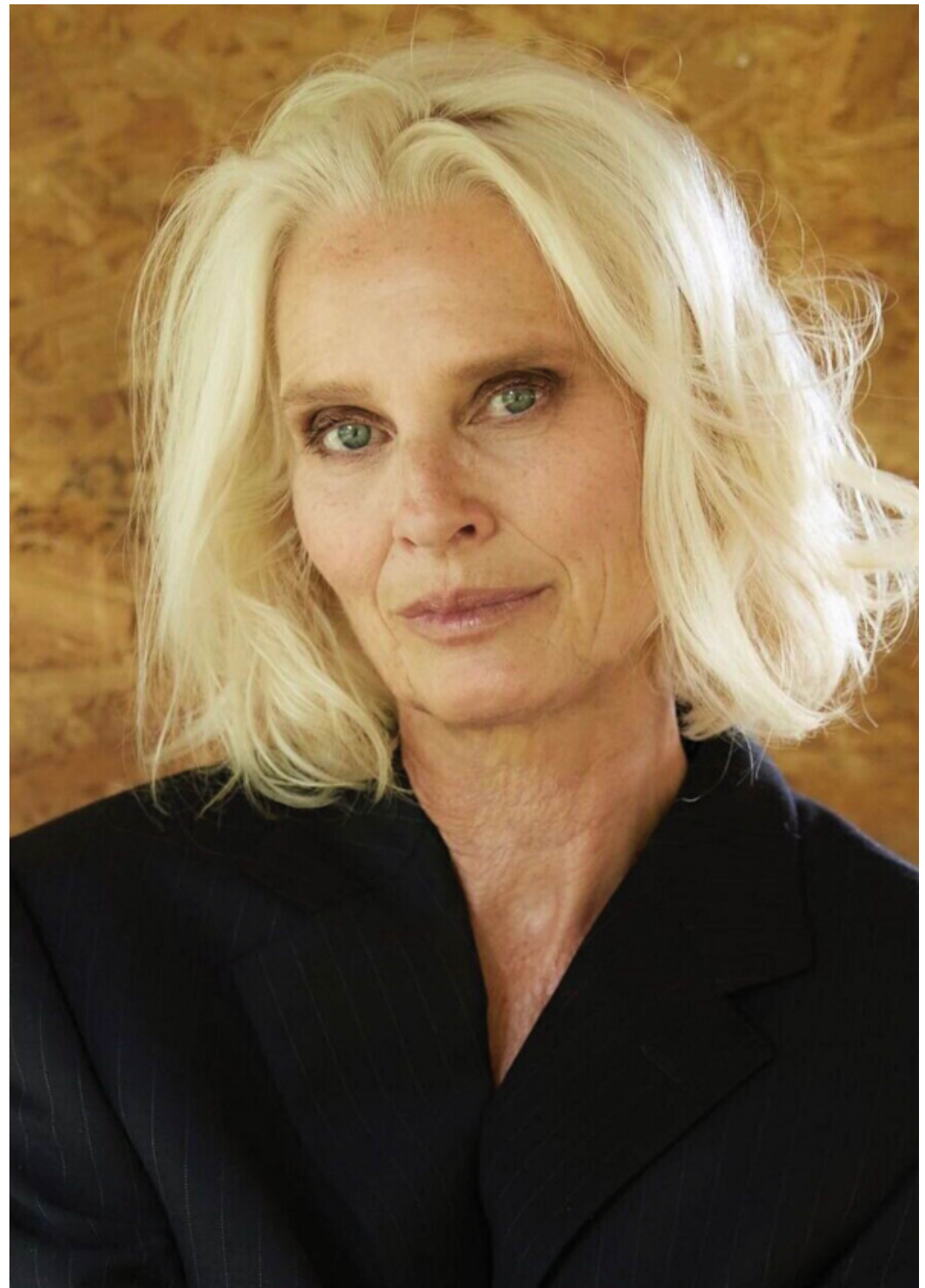
